The "Steller Encounters," which we all know until February 2022 under the name "German-Russian Encounters," have been engaged since 1994, for almost 30 years, in the scholarly exchange regarding the legacy of explorers and expeditions in Northern and Central Asia as well as Alaska since the 18th century.
